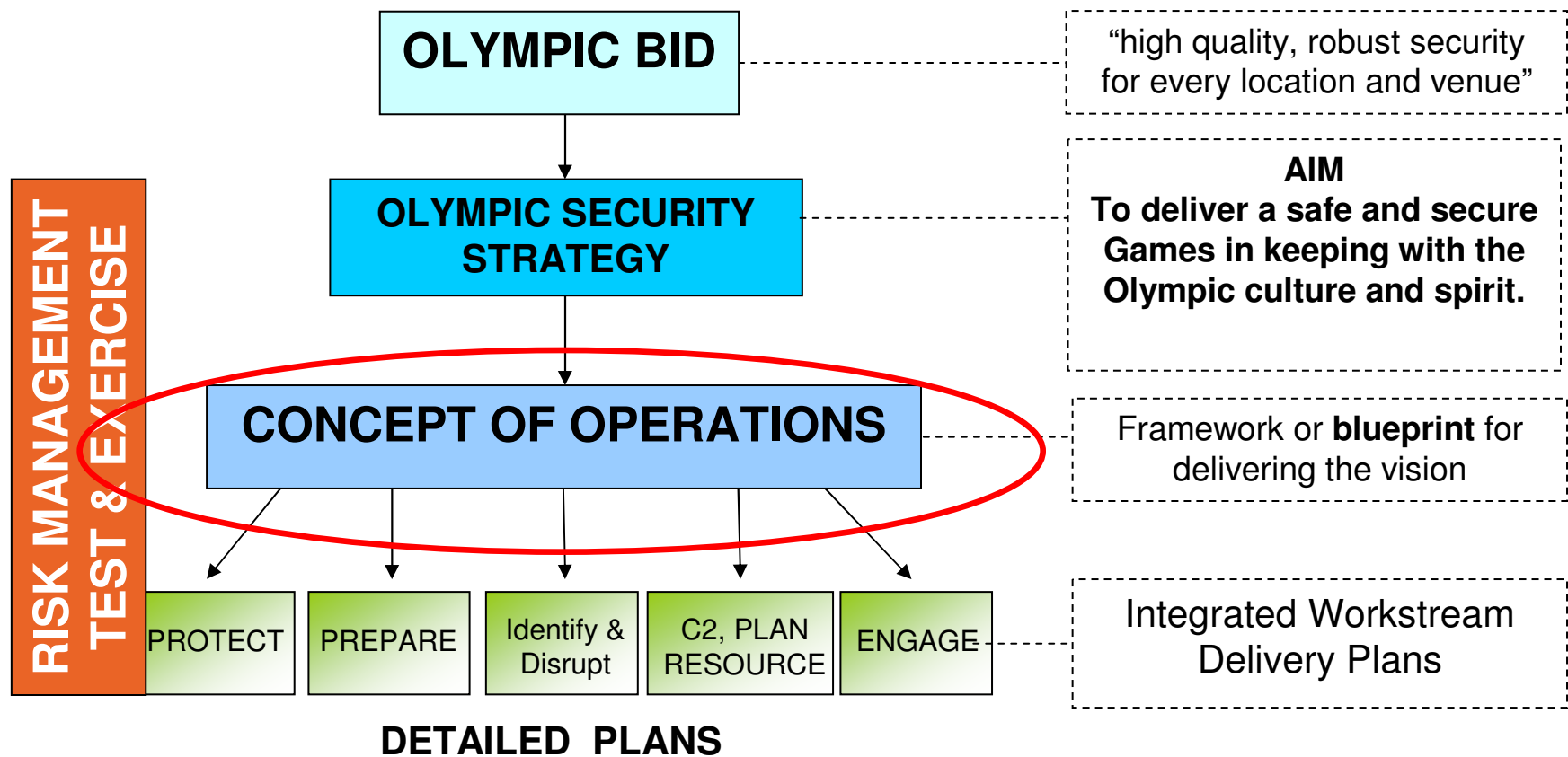

# CONOPS - structure



- Builds on existing best practice.
- Structured around the 5 strategic objectives, and 'Build', 'Overlay' and Games phases.
- Decommissioning and legacy **not in scope**.
- Contents: Scope/Assumptions, **Operational Narrative**, Enablers (Look & Feel, Testing & Exercising, Roles & Responsibilities)
